INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE

The Fund seeks to maximize total investment returns, comprising capital appreciation and interest income by primarily investing in high yield debt instruments that are below investment grade or unrated. It aims to deliver high yield returns with a reduced level of volatility compared against the broader high yield market through an active managed volatility strategy by using both quantitative and qualitative measures. The Fund has a geographical focus on Greater China and Asia.



MANAGER'S COMMENTARY¹⁵

In September, the Asia high-yield bond market extended its upward momentum, achieving its fifth consecutive month of positive returns and reaching a new post-pandemic high. Despite volatility in U.S. Treasury yields, the rally in the Asian high-yield space remained steady, continuing its largely one-directional ascent.

China's economy faced sustained headwinds during the month. The manufacturing PMI edged up to 49.8 but remained below the critical 50-point threshold, reflecting weak demand. Deflationary pressures persisted, with consumer price index (CPI) readings over the past 12 months showing limited growth. Month-over-month CPI increases occurred in only three months, while six months posted declines and the remainder were flat. On the credit side, year-on-year growth in aggregate financing improved to 8.7% in September, up from 8% in January. However, this was largely driven by a surge in government bond issuance, as credit demand from corporates and households continued to decline. Despite these economic challenges, Chinese equity markets rallied during the month.

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MANAGER'S COMMENTARY (Cont'd)¹⁵

In the U.S., the Federal Reserve delivered a widely anticipated 25bps rate cut, its first of the year. Projections from the Fed's dot plot suggest two additional 25bps cuts before year-end and one more in 2026. U.S. Treasury yields dipped ahead of the midmonth FOMC meeting but rebounded on strong labor and growth data, tempering expectations for further rate cuts. Adding to uncertainty, a potential U.S. government shutdown in October raised concerns about delays in key economic data releases, with the impact depending on its duration.

The rally in the Asia high-yield bond market was again led by high-beta sectors. Hong Kong property posted impressive gains of +13.2% month-to-date (MTD), followed by Sri Lanka (+3.26% MTD) and Pakistan (+2.5% MTD). Most other sectors delivered solid returns of over 1% MTD, except China, which lagged at +0.7% MTD. China's underperformance was largely due to Vanke, whose bonds declined by -8.2% MTD after reports that the company had skipped coupon payments on certain onshore loans. Looking ahead, we expect market volatility to persist for the rest of the year, driven by global trade uncertainties and geopolitical challenges. However, we remain constructive on the broader market as we approach 2026.

In September, we started to implement hedges to protect against potential widening in credit spreads, particularly in the U.S., where spreads have been steadily tightening. Following months of fine-tuning, the fund's allocation has now stabilized. We made targeted adjustments to individual holdings to ensure valuations remain attractive, leaving room for upside potential while maintaining a solid carry. As we move into the fourth quarter, we will continue to focus on our strategy, which emphasizes managing volatility and delivering long-term performance over excessive short-term trading
